Her leadership skills and orthopaedic surgical background allow her to effectively help bring personalized surgical implants and instruments to the global marketplace.

Prior to joining Vantus, Dr. Martin served as Chief of Orthopedic Surgery at Boston Veterans Administration Healthcare System—a role she held for more than 12 years. She also served as Associate Chief of Surgery at Boston Veterans Administration from 2008 to 2014. Dr. Martin still holds positions as Staff Surgeon in the Department of Orthopedics at two Boston–area hospitals in the Partners Healthcare System: Brigham and Women's Hospital and Brigham and Women's Faulkner Hospital. She has also served as an Assistant Professor in Orthopaedic Surgery at Harvard Medical School since 2002.

While serving in the Veterans Administration, Dr. Martin became interested in trying to effect healthcare change at a broader, administrative level, striving to improve clinical performance on mandatory performance measures and improve consultation processes between primary care and subspecialties. She served as the National Chair of the Surgical Advisory Board for Orthopaedic Surgery in the Veterans Administration.

She was named to the Top 100 Doctors by Boston Magazine for her work in sports medicine and to America's Top Physicians by the Consumers' Research Council of America. She was also one of 15 fellows selected nationally for participation in a one-year American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS)-sponsored course in leadership designed to prepare younger members of the academy to assume leadership roles.

Dr. Martin is a member of the American Medical Association, the Ruth Jackson Orthopedic Society, the International Cartilage Research Society, the American Orthopaedic Foot and Ankle Society, and many more professional medical societies. She has also been a fellow in the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons since 2000.

Dr. Martin founded a non-profit organization, PediORIF, and led multiple humanitarian surgical trips to the Republic of Georgia. She holds her M.D. degree from Jefferson Medical College and earned her B.S. In Chemistry from Stanford University.

Since joining Vantus, Dr. Martin and founder James Schroeder have collaborated on merging the medical domain with the digital product development domain of both of their respective works. They collaborated on the Vantus R&D study which was funded with congressionally-appropriated financing and routed through the DoD in 2009. Recently, Vantus was awarded the 2017 Top 50 Innovator award, selected out of 500+ national and international emerging companies.
